Dear Parents and Guardians.

We, the Administrative Team would like to wholeheartedly extend our sincere appreciation to you all for providing the necessary support and guidance to your child or ward. Term Two is a very important term as a balance needs to be striked between academic work and other extra-curricular activities including sporting activities that the students will get actively engaged with. Therefore, there are important announcements that we would like you all to take note of:

1. Mid-Year Examination

The Mid-Year Examination will begin on Monday, June 24th and will conclude on Friday, June 28th. Please find the Exam Time Table for your child on page 2. Kindly prioritize these dates and ensure that your child does appear for this important examination. Also, note that there is no resit for any examination and the Internal School Examination Policy applies (important clauses communicated earlier in Term 1) which the students are also very much familiar with. This Examination is crucial as it will provide both the Subject Teachers and the students the platform to identify their strengths and work on their weaknesses to assist in making progressive improvements in the academic performance of the students. Also, note that Home Study is strictly discouraged and normal arrival and departure applies during the Examination week. Any student(s) found engaged in malpractice will be awarded with a zero score in the particular Examination as per the Examination Policy. Kindly ensure your child/ward has all the relevant stationery during the Examination.

2. Mid-Year Examination Awards

Please be informed that a Special Awards function in a School Assembly will be held to honour our High Achievers and also to motivate them further in their studies. **The Awards will be as follows:**

Top Ten Scorers at each level and for students who attain 80% and above in aggregate and are not included in the Top 10 Scorers.

3. Parent Teacher Information Session and CAPS Meeting

This will be organized on Friday 12th July 2024 from 8.30 am. We anticipate meeting every parent or guardian on this day. Also, we are kindly requesting if you could reorganize your schedule and be present on this particular day as it becomes difficult to accommodate the information session on other days.

4. Awareness Against Drug and Illicit Trafficking (IDADAIT) – (Circular 66/24)

The school makes every effort to remind students to refrain from any drug use. A week long awareness will be created in school from 1st to 5th July. We are also requesting parents and guardians to supervise students vigilantly at home and also keep a track of what the children are doing at home, in the weekends and also on social media platforms including the chat groups that they are engaged in.
